

We Are The Witnesses

The Survivors' Secretariat came to be in 2021 through the determined efforts of a small group of Mohawk Institute Survivors. After the Tk'emlups te Secwepemc First Nation reported that 215 children were buried on the grounds of a former residential school in Kamloops, B.C., they came together to create an organization to coordinate a similar search on the grounds associated with the Mohawk Institute. 600 Acres to Search

The Mohawk Institute grounds cover more than 600 acres of land near Brantford, Ontario. This vast area means that the search for unmarked burials will take over two years as Survivors and community members carefully search the area using ground-penetrating radar and LiDAR technology.
