How Technology Is Helping Survivors Uncover the Truth

In addition to gathering records, maps, and documents, Survivors have obtained and are learning how to use technology, such as ground-penetrating radar (GPR). Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR) is also being used to search the lands associated with the former Mohawk Institute for unmarked burials. The Survivors' Secretariat is one of the first communities to use LiDAR for this purpose.

Thousands of Records Exist: Yet Most Are Not Accessible

Throughout Canada, hundreds of thousands, if not millions, of documents and records related to residential schools exist. These records are in many different formats, including: audio files, images/photographs, official reports, digitized documents, and handwritten letters. There may also be "unofficial" records stored in private offices, homes, schools, and other locales. Unfortunately, **only a small number of those** relating to the Mohawk Institute are currently accessible. The Survivors' Secretariat's goal is to find and examine every document and record related to the former Mohawk Institute.


In this edition, we share with you the important fact that many communities, more than originally thought, had their children taken to the Mohawk Institute. Recent Survivor information, matched with records received from various sources, **have identified as many as 33 Impacted Communities**.

The Survivors' Secretariat continues to collect records and receive information from Survivors and their families. Currently, the total number of communities that had their children taken to the Mohawk Institute is still unknown.
