Second Annual **Survivors Gathering** June 27-29



Welcome to the Second Annual Survivors Gathering hosted by Survivors' Secretariat. We welcome you all to the Six Nations of the Grand River and Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation territory.

This year's Gathering will include Survivors of the Mohawk Institute from 17 impacted communities. Approximately 100 Survivors of the Mohawk Institute, having attended the school between 1942-1970, will be joining their peers over the course of 3 days. The Gathering is Survivor-focused, and we hope to provide you with meaningful updates on the progress of the Survivors' Secretariat while also seeking your insight and guidance as we work to **BRING THE CHILDREN HOME**.

The first two days of the Gathering, June 27 and 28, is a private event for Survivors of the Mohawk Institute and their invited guest. Attendees will be required to show their Gathering name tags to gain access to Gathering Place by the Grand. Media will not be permitted to attend on these days.

The third and final day on June 29, is a semi-private event which is open to Survivors of the Mohawk Institute, their invited guests, and intergenerational Survivors. Registration is required. You can add your family to the list at the registration/information desk at the Gathering or direct them to the QR code to self-register. Guests must be on the list in order to gain access to Chiefswood Park or Gathering Place by the Grand.

About the Second Annual Survivors Gathering

Survivors' Secretariat has invited our partners to provide first-hand updates to Mohawk Institute Survivors about our efforts to **UNCOVER, DOCUMENT, and SHARE** the truth about what happened at the Mohawk Institute during its 140+ years of operation. Presentations will take place in the mornings of June 27 and June 28 and will be livestreamed on the Survivors' Secretariat Facebook page.

Following lunch, Survivors will be invited to participate in Sharing Circles where we will seek your feedback. This is your opportunity to share your insights amongst your peers and with the Survivors' Secretariat. These smaller sessions will not be livestreamed however notetakers will be in each room to help document your comments and suggestions.

Photography & Videography: June 26-29, 2023

Photo, video, and audio recording will be occurring throughout the Survivors Gathering for promotional use by Survivors' Secretariat. All attendees will be asked to consent to the potential release and publication of photos and audio/video recordings by Survivors' Secretariat at registration.

This authorization includes, without limitation, the right to publish such images on Survivors' Secretariat websites, in our reports and publications, PR/promotional materials, fundraising materials, and any other Survivors' Secretariat publication. These images may appear in any of a wide variety of formats, including but not limited to print, broadcast, videotape, and electronic/online media.

PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEOGRAPHY

Survivors' Secretariat has hired Mark Burnham Photography to capture the Survivors' Gathering. He will be taking images throughout the event to be used for Survivors' Secretariat's promotional materials. We have also hired Pynx Production to record and livestream the Gathering. Video footage will be taken throughout the Gathering for use by the Secretariat.

DOCUMENTARY FILMING

Survivors' Secretariat has commissioned Sandbay Entertainment to create a documentary about the process to Uncover, Document and Share the truth about what happened at the Mohawk Institute during its 140+ years of operation. A videography team will be attending the Gathering to capture B-reel video images to be used in the documentary. Sandbay is also seeking individual interviews; those wishing to participate should indicate their desire to Secretariat Staff at the registration/information table.

NCTR STATEMENT GATHERING

The National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation (NCTR) will be on-site throughout the Gathering to collect Survivor statements. Your statement will help create a permanent record of what has happened at Mohawk Institute Indian Residential School. These statements and experiences will be audio and video recorded, honoured, and preserved with the NCTR. Private one-on-one statement sessions include the Statement Provider, Statement Gatherer, Health Support and the Provider's family or other support. You have the choice of either public (non-anonymous) or protected (anonymous) statement which can be withdrawn at any time. See your registration package for additional details. JAYS CARE FOUNDATION

Jays Care believes in transformative play. Survivors' Secretariat has invited the Jay's Care Foundation to host a series of family friendly activities on June 29. One activity will ask Survivors: "if you could use your platform to help share a message from you to future generations what would that message be?" Video responses may be considered for broadcast during the month of September by the foundation. Participation is completely voluntary. For more information see your registration package. Wellness Supports

“The mind and body work together. What one feels, the other reacts to.”

Cultural and Wellness Health Supports will be available on-site throughout the Gathering. Support workers will be wearing orange nametags and can be approached at any time for assistance. Due to the difficult nature of the topics discussed during the Gathering, we encourage guests to access these supports.

Private rooms are available for one-on-one sessions. Additional cultural supports are available in the Smudge Room at Gathering Place or at the Sacred Fire at Chiefswood Park. These spaces are intended for relaxation and centring.

SMUDGE ROOM

The Smudge room is located off of the lobby at Gathering Place. It will be a quiet place for Survivors and their guest to relax and reset. Refreshments and traditional medicines will be available. Wellness supports will be on-site.

GATHERING PLACE

SACRED FIRE

A sacred fire will be lit at Chiefswood Park the morning of Tues. June 27 before the start of the Survivors Gathering. The fire will be tended to until the Gathering closes on Thur. June 29. Refreshments and traditional medicines will be available at the fire throughout this time. Wellness supports will also be available. The fire can be accessed daily between 5:00 am – 11:00 pm.

WELCOME DINNER AT BEST WESTERN

Survivors will begin to arrive the evening of June 26. Survivors and their support are invited to a buffet dinner at Myra's inside the Best Western. Dinner will be available between 6 PM and 9 PM. Guests are then invited to continue to greet their peers at the Survivors Lounge located inside of the Gretzky Room.

SURVIVORS LOUNGE

A room has been dedicated to Survivors and their guests to meet and mingle inside the Gretzky Room at the Best Western. The room will be opened daily between 5 PM and 11 PM. Coffee, tea, refreshments, and snacks will be available during these hours. Games and activities will also be held for those wishing to participate. Wellness Supports will be on-site and will be wearing **orange nametags**.

SUNRISE CEREMONY

A sunrise ceremony will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday morning. Transportation from the hotel is available and departs at 5:30 AM. The ceremony will be held at approx. 6 AM. Participants will then be transported to Gathering Place for a continental breakfast between 7:30 AM and 8:30 AM. Refreshments, traditional medicines and wellness supports will be available on-site.

TRADITIONAL GAMES & PAINTING ACTIVITY

Onkwehonwe Games encourages participants to experience the culture through traditional games and storytelling. Dallas, a former professional lacrosse player, used games to teach and discuss culture in a safe and positive environment. Participants will have the opportunity to try a variety of traditional games. Alternatively, guests can participate in a rock painting exercise. Guests can choose to donate their rocks to Survivors' Secretariat to be displayed in their new medicine garden or take them home.

MOHAWK VILLAGE MEMORIAL PARK (MVMP)

The MVMP seeks to address the loss of childhood caused by the residential school experience and honour the children that attended the Mohawk Institute Indian Residential School from 1834 to 1970. MVMP is a charitable organization with a voluntary board of directors made up of former students of the Mohawk Institute Indian Residential School and their descendants. MVMP will provide an update on MVMP plans for the park, fundraising efforts, and progress to date.

June 27 Sharing Circle: Mohawk Village Memorial Park | Commemoration

This sharing circle will ask Mohawk Institute Survivors how they would like to see students and impacted communities commemorated. Participants will get to have a closer look at plans for the MVMP and share their ideas amongst their peers. A live-draw muralist will capture the conversation.

Dr. Hamilton will walk Survivors through the data collection process and will provide a summary of Ground Search activities to date. He will overview various data collection methods and will outline the challenges and barriers to data analysis.

This sharing circle will ask participants if they want to share information about where the Ground Search Team should focus their energy. Participants will also be able to see how a search grid is set up and watch how the Ground Penetrating Radar machines are operated. The Survivors' Secretariat has appointed an Indigenous Human Rights Monitor and Police Liaison to oversee the search for the unmarked burials and missing children associated with the Mohawk Institute. Dr. Jacobs and Mark Pritchard will provide an update on the shift from a criminal investigation to a Coroner's investigation. They will also share how the Secretariat is working with Survivors to collect information that may lead to the discovery of unmarked burials or missing children of the Mohawk Institute.

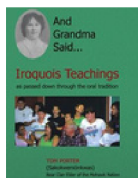
June 28 Sharing Circle: WCC, Tim Johnson & Parks Canada | Interpretation of Mohawk Institute
